Proverbs 1:20–2:8

Wisdom cries aloud in the street,
in the markets she raises her voice;

²¹ at the head of the noisy streets she cries out;
at the entrance of the city gates she speaks:

²² “How long, O simple ones, will you love being simple?
How long will scoffers delight in their scoffing
and fools hate knowledge?”

²³ If you turn at my reproof, [a]
behold, I will pour out my spirit to you;
I will make my words known to you.

²⁴ Because I have called and you refused to listen,
have stretched out my hand and no one has heeded,

²⁵ because you have ignored all my counsel
and would have none of my reproof,

²⁶ I also will laugh at your calamity;
I will mock when terror strikes you,

²⁷ when terror strikes you like a storm
and your calamity comes like a whirlwind,
when distress and anguish come upon you.

²⁸ Then they will call upon me, but I will not answer;
they will seek me diligently but will not find me.

Case Study Notes:

What Should I Do Now? Wise Decision-Making Case Studies

1. Jenna is a senior microbio major. She wants to be a vet and is considering grad schools. Her family strongly desires her to stay close to home. Her home church is okay, but doesn't have a clear value on disciple-making. Her second option is one of the nation's best 3 year vet programs, but there are no gospel-preaching churches within an hour drive. The third program is in the Midwest, and a friend mentioned a solid, gospel-preaching church within biking distance of the school. What should Jenna consider when making her decision? How can she honor the Lord in her choice?
2. Danielle is a finance major and has been accepted to two internship opportunities for the summer and she has one week to decide which she will do. The first option is a ten-week training and discipleship program in campus ministry. The second is to intern with an investment firm. What decision does Danielle make?
3. Noel became a Christian about a year ago. Following Jesus has been a tough but life-giving process as she has had to let go of a lot of old habits to embrace her new life with Jesus. One of those old habits was hooking up on Tindr and trying to find fulfillment in sex. Kyle is another student at her school who she met on Tindr and formed a complicated relationship with him. She hasn't talked with him in months, but today she ran into him. He asked her if she wanted to come study with him in the library. She agreed and they chatted for a while and studied. After a while Kyle asked if she wanted to come back to his place and just hang out. Noel reasons that she's been doing fine just chatting here and tells him she's glad to come over, but only for a little while because she's different now and doesn't want things to be like they were before. Kyle agrees. Did Noel make a wise choice? Why or why not?
4. Mia is a spiritually mature junior. She has been dating Jeremy, a spiritually mature senior, for a while. They have a healthy relationship, and Jeremy has mentioned engagement. There isn't anything wrong, Mia just isn't sure if that is what she wants. How should Mia wisely think through this decision?
5. Joy just turned 21 and is invited to go out for drinks with some unbelieving classmates. What wisdom should she consider before making her decision?
6. Maria is a nursing student struggling to keep up with the course load and extra paperwork from clinical, so she often stays up all night to do the work in order to get an A. She isn't procrastinating, it's just literally too much. How can Maria approach this problem wisely and respond in a way that honors the Lord?
